As we take on that model, we start to understand that law enforcement's appropriate role in that public health viewpoint is by taking care of the acute sickness. We're also able to start focusing more energy upstream in the intervention and then the prevention roles too.

There are a lot of overlapping issues, for sure. You know, we see that with public health and with social issues in general. You know the connection between community violence and, you know, access to health care and access to healthy foods, et cetera. But it's really important to name violence as a public health issue. To name violence as something that is being impacted and intersects with these other public health issues but is in itself its own thing and deserves its own attention.
